Professional Development Program

Overview

Our professional development program was inspired by the national fraternity and designed by active members at Missouri University of Science and Technology (MST). We felt it was important to share valuable information with each other and utilize the many different resources available to us through the fraternity, campus, and community. By providing members with services and opportunities, we have created an atmosphere where young men can learn, have fun and prepare themselves for professional life after college, all at the same time. This program consists of three parts; Phi Kap lecture series, resume critiquing, and internships and co-ops.

Phi Kap Lecture Series

Each semester, we schedule three to four informative seminars. These seminars take place on Thursday nights, generally lasting one hour. Presenters include active members, alumni, and members of the community. Each presenter is asked to give a PowerPoint presentation in our chapter room. This is a great opportunity for members to learn about different topics, practice their public speaking skills and ask questions. Topics have included academic success at MST, alcohol awareness, personal finance, credit counseling, career advice, and preparation for interviews and career fairs. Members are encouraged to come up with new and exciting topics that interest them. Some future topics may include healthy living, things every man should know, personal relationship advice, and many more.

Resume Critiquing

Every college student should have a respectable resume. Without one, finding a job is nearly impossible. Some students take this for granted and do not know how to effectively create a resume employers will notice. Using techniques learned through the national fraternity, campus, and real-world experience, our members can help your son perfect his resume. We started doing resume critiquing five years ago and our members will agree that this service has been one of the most helpful and informative. Competitive Pricing

Unlike what you may have been told, fraternity life is very affordable, especially here at Phi Kappa Theta. Throughout the years, we have remained competitive with other campus housing options. Below is a table comparing housing costs.

Our meal plan includes accessibility to every meal cooked in a buffet-style serving with all leftovers being stored in the commercial walk-in refrigeration unit. This also includes our steward providing food on the weekends. The kitchen within the house is a commercial-sized meal-prepping area that allows for 24-hour use.

As you can see, we are currently offering competitive pricing compared to other campus housing options and we plan to keep it that way. The \$10,614 annual figure above includes room and board, 15 freshly cooked meals per week, laundry, cable TV, wireless internet, network printer, and many other amenities.

Payments can either be made at the beginning of each semester, which includes a discount for paying early, or monthly payments throughout each semester. New Associate Members will be charged a one-time Associate Member Fee of \$75. All future fraternity dues are included in board bills and initiation fees are covered by scholarships.
