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Professional Development Program

Overview

Major Officer Skills Development

Competitive Pricing

Unlike what you may have heard, fraternity life is very affordable, especially here at Phi Kappa Theta. Throughout the years, we have remained competitive with other campus housing options. Below is a table comparing housing costs.

Our meal plan includes accessibility to every meal cooked in a buffet-style serving with all leftovers being stored in the commercial walk-in refrigeration unit. This also includes our steward providing food on the weekends. The kitchen within the house is a commercial-sized meal-prepping area that allows for 24-hour use.

As you can see, we are currently offering competitive pricing compared to other campus housing options and we plan to keep it that way. The \$11,248 annual figure above includes room and board, 15 meals per week, laundry, cable TV, wireless internet, network printer, and many other amenities.

Payments can either be made at the beginning of each semester, which includes a discount for paying early, or monthly payments throughout each semester. New Associate Members will be charged a one-time Associate Member Fee of \$75. All future fraternity dues are included in board bills and initiation fees are covered by scholarships.
